Here are a few snippets from the book.





i, my name is Poonam (Anjali Rajbhar) and I am 17 years old. Originally I am from Undura in Uttar Pradesh. As a family we shifted to Mumbain 2014. That is, my parents, three sisters and myself. I am the eldest and two of my sisters go to the local municipal school and my youngest sister is just 5, so is not yet enrolled. My mother does some beading work and my father is a gardener.

My parents seemed very frustrated and unhappy as they conceived all girl children. Our financial condition was often very bad, because of which I was not sent regularly to school. I often helped my mother in sticking beads to clothing, through which we earned some money. My father and mother often abused me verbally and physically.

So, one day I decided to run away from my home and on 14th June 2018, after being tortured and beaten up by my parents, I finally did so. For almost three days I roamed around on the station and train and then a woman met me who handed me over to the police and told them that I didn't have any parents. The police then handed me over to the Kasturba Government Home and there too I mentioned that I was an orphan.
