SENDIL DISTRIBUTING DRY RATION



Covid-19 has caused major disruptions all over India and the situation in Hallegudadhahalli (HGH) has taken a turn for the worse at this time. The ongoing pandemic has already affected many aspects of daily life in the community including several daily wagers who have no income to support their families. While many parts of the HGH community have been sealed due to the growing number of cases, this situation has threatened numerous lives, especially that of the elderly women and widows who depend on making their ends meet by working in events, by tying flowers or by working in the nearby Agarbathi (Incense sticks) factories.

Sendil, our Community Organiser identified the desperate needs of these women. He started connecting with like-minded institutions for support and also connected with his friends who directed him to Don Bosco, a non-profit that provided us with 25 bags of dry ration. This was distributed to the 25 elderly women and widows. They were very grateful for this timely help.

We are so proud of staff like Sendil who go an extra mile in building the lives of those in our communities at this time of crisis.
