WHAT IS HUMAN TRAFFICKING?

WHAT: Human Trafficking is the recruitment or movement of persons, by means of threat or use of force, deception or coercion for the purpose of exploitation.

HOW: People are tricked into situations where they are bought, sold, abused, and exploited in many different ways: sexual exploitation, forced labour, street crime, domestic servitude or even the sale of organs and human sacrifice. Men, women and children are trafficked within their own countries and across international borders. Trafficking affects every continent and every country.

WHY: People are trafficked primarily for financial gain. Human trafficking is a multi-billion dollar industry. It is a high profit, low risk crime. It is easier to move people around today than at any other time in history.

WHAT DO WE DO?

At Oasis India works in communities with anti-human trafficking as our key focus. We liaise with schools, corporates and colleges to shed light upon the issue of human trafficking.

The anti-human trafficking groups and change agent groups, we helped start, have been actively speaking up on social issues through street plays, skits and sensitisation programmes. It is our goal to help group members realise that it is THEIR community and THEY should initiate the change.
