Say "NO" To Human Trafficking

On 30th July, we observed World Day Against Trafficking in Persons. Our projects across different cities and villages came together to mark the day with powerful events and sessions, joined by schools, families, and community members. Here are some pictures and highlights from the day see it for yourself!



Nalasopara

Our Nalasopara team joined hands with Holy Mary School in Bilalpada to mark #WorldDayAgainstTrafficking in Persons.

81 students from Classes 8 to 10 came together to learn about human trafficking, how it harms people and our community, and what we can do to stop it. The group discussions were amazing—we shared ideas on how to speak up and protect those who can't.

We also held an important session on POCSO (Protection of Children from Sexual Offences) with 38 young people from the community. Thanks to Mr. Nayan Mali and the team for leading this!

Together, they took a pledge to keep children safe and to be guardians of their neighbourhoods.





Churachandpur

In Churachandpur, we came together for a powerful event filled with learning, networking, and action in Churachandpur.

48 participants

17 men | 31 women

6 NGOs, 6 schools, 3 CSOs, 3 student groups, 2 govt agencies – all in one room!

The day was packed with:

- Awareness sessions on the many forms of trafficking
- Group discussions on how to work better "together"
- Action plans to raise awareness, prevent trafficking, and respond faster
- A powerful pledge session where everyone committed to take a stand!







Chennai

On World Day Against Trafficking in Persons (30th July), our team at Oasis India hit the ground running in Chennai—chatting with students, connecting with communities, and raising much-needed awareness.

Bengaluru

In Bengaluru, we had an awesome awareness session at BBMP Govt Composite College, Azad Nagar – Bengaluru

Over 150 students from different streams (HEBA, PCMB, PCMC & HEPS) showed up – with 96 girls and 57 boys in the crowd. Even a few staff members joined in too!

We had some real conversations about human trafficking – what it looks like, how it affects people, and how young people like YOU can be part of the solution.

Together, we're spreading awareness and standing up for what's right



Meghalaya

In Timbokgre and Chibra, Meghalaya, we talked about the issue of Human Trafficking in India, and why this day matters, and how it all began. The students shared their thoughts through powerful drawings and words — and honestly, they amazed us!

45 amazing women from our Aruna DIC project came together for an open and honest session on menstrual health, led by the Rotaract Club of Northern Suburban.

From hygiene tips to clearing common myths, it was a safe space where women felt free to ask questions and share openly. Everyone went home with free sanitary pads and new confidence!


Meet Lhingneineng from Tuinom — she went from an ordinary village girl to a tailoring pro!

These are some amazing women's tops she just designed recently— don't they look super beautiful & professional!


Her dream? To start her own business and empower more women in her village.
